Sacagawea

Not a lot is known about Sacagawea before she was twelve years old. At the age of twelve, she and several girls in her Shoshone tribe were kidnapped by the Hidatsa tribe during a battle. She became the wife of a trapper from

Sacagawea, with baby in tow, was a huge help to the Corps of Discovery. Not only was she a guide and interpreter, she showed other tribes that the group's trip was a peaceful one. She helped in other ways too. Sacagawea managed to rescue items that had fallen from a boat that turned over, which included the journals of Lewis and Clark. Additionally, it was because of her that they had great success in getting horses to cross the Rocky Mountains. Her brother w


returned to the Hidatsa tribe. Three years later, they moved to Missouri where William Clark lived. Here, Sacagawea gave birth to a daughter, Lizette. It is believed that Sacagawea died soon after in 1812 of an unknown illness, and that William Clark adopted her children.


