The Native Americans joined the French in the fight because they were afraid that the British would take over their land. George Washington was fighting on the side of the British. This was before the colonists needed freedom from Great Britain. It wasn't until after the British won the French and Indian War that King George III began to treat the colonists unfairly. He began creating taxes and laws that the Americans found to be unfair.

George Washington, along with representatives from the other colonies, met as the Continental Congress. They decided to fight the British together. In May of 1775, Congress chose Washington to be the General of the Continental Army. He had a lough job because most of the soldiers had no experience in the army. They were just farmers going up against the world's greatest military. There were times when many of the American soldiers wanted to give up. Washington encouraged them and remained by their side through the losing battles and the bad conditions they sometimes faced. He proved to the soldiers that he was trustworthy and they knew they could count on him. He led them to victory over the British.

Washington served two terms as President of the United States. He only made executive decisions that would unite the country, like constructing roads between states and building post offices. He stepped down after serving eight years because he didn't want to rule too long, like a king.




After the Revolutionary War, the United States government was limited by the Articles of Confederation. The delegates of the Constitutional Convention did not want the government to have too much power, as the British government did. There was not a president or a national court. The government was very weak, and the delegates were divided on how to make it stronger. One of the biggest conflicts was between the large and small state: but no one could agree on how to coun the votes. The larger states wanted the


all of the states to have an equal number of representatives. Finally, after much debate, the delegates decided on a two-house Congress with a Senate and a House of Representatives. It was called making groups would make up the Leaislative Branch of the government The delegates also decided there should be one head of the government: the President. The Congress, as well as the help keep the President from having too much power, so he wouldn't be another dictator like King George III. Since many people were still very anxious about a government leader, the delegates knev they had to elect someone that the people already trusted.
