






This unit can be used in a notebook, or a lapbook! I like to use composition notebooks for my students so they can keep everything from the year together to use for studying for our high-stakes test at the end of the year.

I created the passages small enough that they could fit on the same page with the foldable, but you could also have them glue the passage and foldable on two sideby-side pages to allow more room for note-taking.









Remind students to draw or sketch the details of each Act the best they can- and labeling those sketches isn't a bad idea either.

If you turn the pentagon so that "who" is on top, the passage will fit perfectly inside.







Underlining, highlighting, or taking notes next to the flapbook is a great way to help organize their thoughts for their summary!

Again, you could glue these on side-by-side pages if you prefer to allow for more note-taking.
